

## Get Organized



- Create a study space.
- Equip the study area with needed supplies.
- Record tests & assignments in an agenda.
- Date your class notes & keep them in chronological order in your notebook.
- Put homework in the bookbag as soon as it is complete.
- Put the packed bookbag by the door each night.



## Taking & Reviewing Notes

- Date notes & keep them in order.
- Emphasize important ideas by highlighting.
- Make flash cards.
- Read through your notes from each class nightly.
- Start reviewing for tests as soon as they are announced.
- In preparing for a test, ask yourself, "What is the teacher emphasizing in class?"

## Spend Time Wisely

- Budget your time-write out a weekly schedule.
- Begin homework as soon as you get home from school.
- Complete harder homework assignments first.
- Turn off the cell phone while doing homework.

## Test Taking Tips

- Look over the entire test before you begin.
- In true or false questions look for qualifier words like none, always or never. Questions using those words are rarely true.
- With multiple choice questions read the stem question with each answer option before selecting an answer.
- After completing the test, go back and review your answers.



## Parent Tips

- Regularly check your child's grades in parent portal.
- Access teacher Wiki & Canvas pages.
- Learn what educational webtools such as MobyMax, Study Island, or IXL are available at your child's school.
- Create routine open communication with your child's teachers.
- Actively promote regular school attendance. Studies have shown that regular school attendance is a key factor in student academic success.



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
